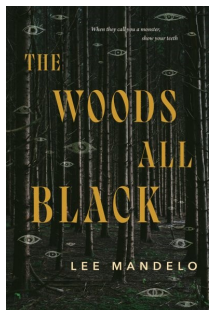
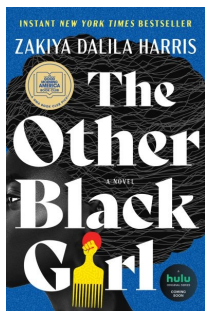


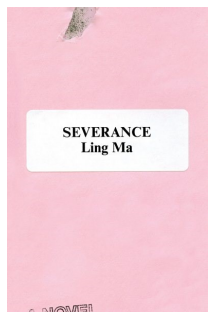
The Buffalo Hunter

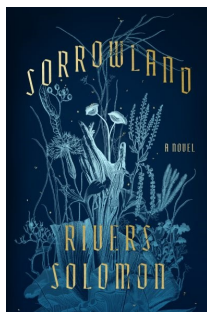

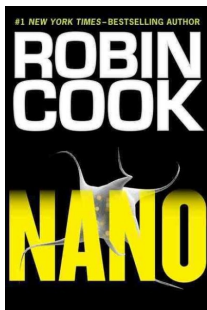

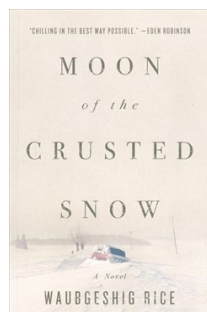
and not to ask questions about their source of funding.

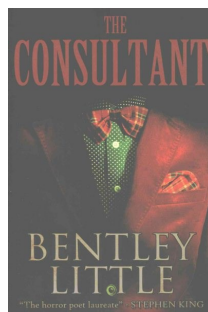
A London-based Pakistani translator furthers her stalled career by attending a mysterious language school that boasts near-instant fluency -- but at a secret, sinister cost.

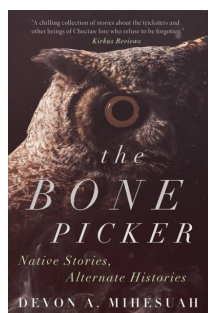
Imagines a small community on the precipice of winter without power or communication where leaders must grapple with control, restore order, and save their people from a grave fate.

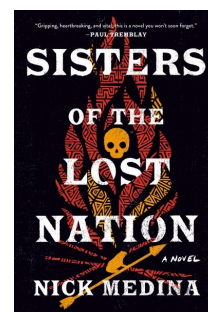
