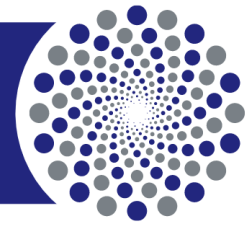

Anderson, Sophie – *The Girl Who Speaks Bear* +Anderson, Fiction
Longing to know who she really is after being discovered in a bear cave as a baby, 12-year-old Yanka begins a remarkable transformation that forces her to leave a loving foster home in search of a place where she truly belongs.

Andrews, Christiane M. – *Spindlefish and Stars* +Andrews, Fiction; +And, Digital Audio Players
When Clo's father goes missing, she takes the mysterious items he left behind and journeys across the sea to find him, but is stranded on a strange island and must learn to spin fish into yarn to unravel the secret of all that has happened.

Bashardoust, Melissa – *Girl, Serpent, Thorn* YA Bashardoust, Fiction; YA Bashardoust, CD-Audio Books*
Soraya, a princess cursed to be poisonous to the touch, has lived eighteen years in the shadows, but as her twin brother's wedding approaches, she faces choices with unimaginable consequences.

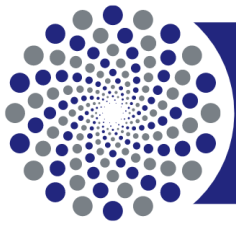

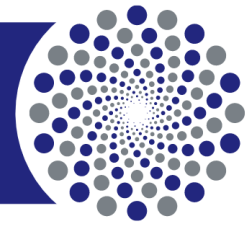

Burnell, Cerrie – *I Am Not a Label*

+920 Bur, Non-Fiction

In this biography anthology, meet 34 artists, thinkers, athletes, and activists with disabilities, from past and present.

Callender, Kacen – *King and the Dragonflies*

+Callender, Fiction*

One boy's grief takes him beyond the bayous of his backyard, to learn that there is no right way to be yourself.

Chewins, Hayley – *The Sisters of Straygarden Place*

+Chewins, Fiction

Seven years ago, the Ballastian sisters' parents left them in a magical house surrounded by sinister silver grass. Now Winnow has ventured outside, and everything Mayhap thought she knew about her home, family, and herself unravels.

Cisneros, Ernesto – *Efrén Divided*

+Cisneros, Fiction; +Cis, CD-Audio Books*

While his father works two jobs, seventh-grader Efrén Nava must take care of his twin siblings, kindergartners Max and Mia, after their mother is deported to Mexico. Includes glossary of Spanish words.

Córdova, Zoraida – *The Way to Rio Luna*

Dionne, Evette – *Lifting as We Climb: Black Women's Battle for the Ballot Box*

An eye-opening book that tells the important, overlooked story of Black women as a force in the suffrage movement--when fellow suffragists did not accept them as equal partners in the struggle.

Discovering the still-beating heart of a formidable deity believed long dead, 15-year-old Hark races to keep the dangerous object out of the hands of smugglers, scientists, and cult fanatics in the hope of saving a best friend's life.

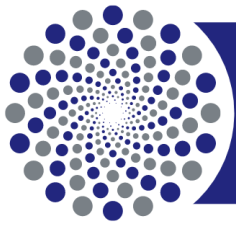

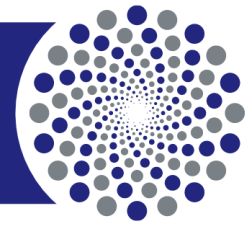

YA Hughes, Graphic Novels*

On a visit to San Francisco, Kiku finds herself transported in time back to the 1940s Japanese-American internment camp that her late grandmother, Ernestina, was forcibly relocated to during World War II.

Jamieson, Victoria – *When Stars are Scattered*

+Jamieson, Graphic Novels*

This remarkable graphic novel is about growing up in a refugee camp, as told by a former Somali refugee.

Jung, Mike – *The Boys in the Back Row*

+Jung, Fiction*

Best friends Matt and Eric are hatching a plan for one big final adventure together before Eric moves away.

Kassner, Heather – *The Forest of Stars*

Layne, Aliza – *Beetle & the Hollowbones*

12-year-old goblin and witch-in-training Beetle enlists her former best friend, Kat Hollowbones, to help stop Kat's sorceress aunt from demolishing the mall where Beetle's friend Blob Ghost is trapped.

A Lipan Apache teen with supernatural gifts must solve her cousin's murder before it's too late.

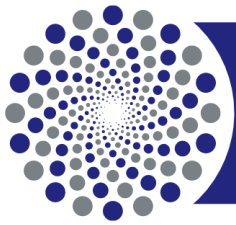

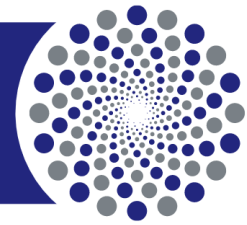

Oppel, Kenneth – *Bloom*

When the world is overtaken by monster alien plants that emit toxic pollens and swallow up people, three kids on a remote island look for clues in their unusual allergies to understand their immunity to the invaders.

Park, Linda Sue – *Prairie Lotus*

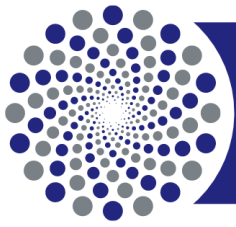

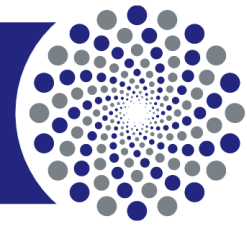

Woodson, Jacqueline – *Before the Ever After*

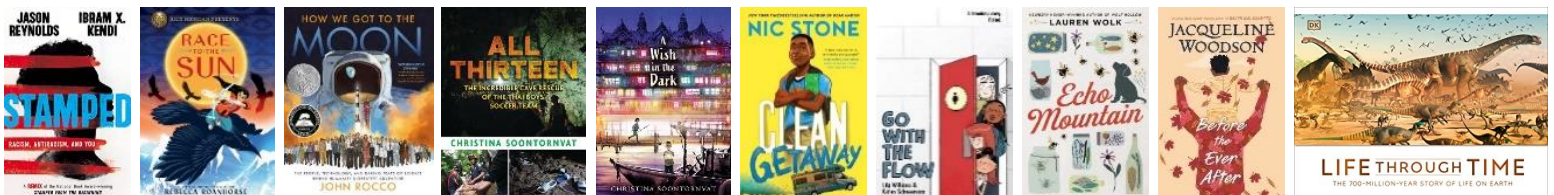
