Acevedo, Elizabeth – Clap When You Land YA Acevedo, Fiction; YA Acevedo, CD-Audio Books* A novel in verse that follows two teenage sisters separated by a secret, an ocean, and their father. Papi kept one family in New York and another in the Dominican Republic, but after his death their lives will be forever connected.

Albertalli, Becky – Yes No Maybe So YA Albertalli, Fiction; YA Albertalli, Digital Audio Books* A shy campaign volunteer and a girl navigating a difficult Ramadan unexpectedly fall in love against a backdrop of escalating community activism.

Arnold, Elana K. – *Red Hood*

Living a quiet life with her grandmother in Seattle, Bisou Martel is attacked by a mysterious wolf on the night of her school's homecoming before confronting difficult questions about her past and her growing sense of empowerment.

Atta, Dean – The Black Flamingo

A fierce coming-of-age novel about identity and the liberating power of drag follows the experiences of a mixed-race teen in London who struggles to connect with his heritage before coming out and establishing his place in Drag Society.

Barnes, Jennifer – *The Inheritance Games* YA Barnes, Fiction; YA Barnes, CD-Audio Books* When a Connecticut teenager inherits vast wealth and an eccentric estate from the richest man in Texas, she must also live with his surviving family and solve a series of puzzles to discover how she earned her inheritance.

Bashardoust, Melissa – Girl, Serpent, Thorn YA Bashardoust, Fiction; YA Bashardoust, CD-Audio Books* Soraya, a princess cursed to be poisonous to the touch, has lived eighteen years in the shadows, but as her twin brother's wedding approaches, she faces choices with unimaginable consequences.

Brown, Echo – Black Girl Unlimited: The Remarkable Story of a Teenage Wizard **YA Brown, Fiction*** From age six through her high school valedictory speech, believing she and her mother are wizards helps young Echo cope with poverty, hunger, her mother's drug abuse, and much more.

Brown, Roseanne A. – A Song of Wraiths and Ruin YA Brown, Fiction; YA Brown, CD-Audio Books* Malik, a refugee desperate to save his sister, and Karina, a grieving Princess with a mission, vow to destroy each other even as a mutual attraction builds between the two.

With contributions by leading YA authors, this diverse collection of vampire tales features supernatural characters engaged in social justice movements, attempting to take selfies without reflections, and avoiding family matchmaking.



Garber, Romina – Lobizona

When her mother is arrested by ICE, sixteen-year-old Argentinian Manu, who thinks she is hiding in a Miami apartment because she is an undocumented immigrant, discovers that her entire existence is illegal.

Giles, L. R. – Not So Pure and Simple

High school junior Del Rainey unwittingly joins a Purity Pledge class at church, hoping to get closer to his crush, Kiera.

Ha, Robin – Almost American Girl: An Illustrated Memoir YA Biography Ha, Graphic Novels, Non-Fiction* Moving abruptly from Seoul to Alabama, a Korean teen struggles in a hostile blended home and a new school where she does not speak English before forging unexpected connections in a local comic drawing class.

Hammonds Reed, Christina – The Black Kids

With the Rodney King riots closing in on high school senior Ashley and her family, the privileged bubble she has enjoyed, protecting her from the difficult realities most black people face, begins to crumble.

Hardinge, Frances – Deeplight

Discovering the still-beating heart of a formidable deity believed long dead, 15-year-old Hark races to keep the dangerous object out of the hands of smugglers, scientists, and cult fanatics in the hope of saving a best friend's life.

Hughes, Kiku – Displacement

On a visit to San Francisco, Kiku finds herself transported in time back to the 1940s Japanese-American internment camp that her late grandmother, Ernestina, was forcibly relocated to during World War II.

Ibañez, Isabel - Woven in Moonlight

A rollicking political fantasy inspired by Bolivian history and filled with irrepressible heroines, opulent settings, twisty court intrigue, bloody revolutions, and mouthwatering feasts.

Ifueko, Jordan – Raybearer

Raised in isolation, Tarisai yearns for the closeness she could have as one of the Crown Prince's Council of 11, but her mother, The Lady, has magically compelled Tarisai to kill the Crown Prince.

Iloh, Candice – Every Body Looking

A mixed heritage dancer's coming of age within the African diaspora is shaped by abuse at the hands of a cousin, her mother's descent into addiction, and her father's efforts to create a Nigerian-inspired home in America.

Jackson, Holly – A Good Girl's Guide to Murder

Pippa is determined to find the real killer in a closed murder case, but not everyone wants her meddling in the past.

When superstar Korey Fields sees Enchanted Jones sing at an audition, it seems her dreams of stardom are within reach, but the dream turns into a nightmare when she wakes up with blood on her hands next to Korey's dead body.

Jamieson, Victoria – When Stars are Scattered

This remarkable graphic novel is about growing up in a refugee camp, as told by a former Somali refugee.

Johnson, George M. – All Boys aren't Blue: A Memoir-Manifesto

In essays, prominent journalist and LGBTQIA+ activist George M. Johnson explores growing up as a gay black man.

Johnson, Leah – You Should See Me in a Crown

A Black, underprivileged misfit from a wealthy, prom-obsessed community plans to attend a prestigious medical college before the unexpected loss of her financial aid forces her to compete for her school's prom gueen scholarship.

Kaito – Blue Flag Vol. 1

An unexpected love quadrangle with a dash of unrequited love as two classmates, a boy and a girl, begin to fall for each other when each of their best friends have already fallen for them.

LaCour, Nina – Watch Over Me

A newly graduated Mila emerges from foster care to accept a job on an isolated Northern California Coast farm where she confronts haunting memories and the traumas of her fellow residents.

Leno, Katrina – Horrid

Following her father's sudden death, Jane North-Robinson and her mother are forced to move to the old North house in Maine, where Jane uncovers her family's disturbing secrets.

Little Badger, Darcie – *Elatsoe*

A Lipan Apache teen with supernatural gifts must solve her cousin's murder before it's too late.

Lockhart, E. – Again Again

YA Lockhart, Fiction; YA Lockhart, Digital Audio Players

Rising high school senior Adelaide Buchwald grapples with a family catastrophe and romantic upheaval while confronting secrets she keeps, her ideas about love, and the weird grandiosity of the human mind.

Mabry, Samantha – Tigers, Not Daughters

YA Mabry, Fiction* Three sisters are shadowed by guilt and grief over the loss of their oldest sister, who still haunts their house.

McCauley, Kyrie – If These Wings Could Fly

YA Namey, Fiction* Seventeen-year-old Lila Reyes, furious when her parents send her to the English countryside to recover from grief and heartbreak, unexpectedly falls in love with a teashop clerk and England, itself.

Nayeri, Daniel – *Everything Sad is Untrue*

A sprawling, evocative, and groundbreaking autobiographical novel told in the unforgettable and hilarious voice of a young Iranian refugee. A powerfully layered novel that questions: Who owns the truth? Who speaks it? Who believes it?

Ness, Patrick – Burn

YA Ness, Fiction; YA Ness, CD-Audio Books* When her family is forced to hire a dragon to work their farm, Sarah is surprised by the dragon's protective nature before learning about a prophecy that links her to a deadly assassin, a dragon-worshipping cult, and two FBI agents.

Oshiro, Mark – Each of Us a Desert

Destined to a solitary life in the desert, a storyteller longing for a kindred spirit encounters the cold and beautiful daughter of her village's murderous conqueror before nightmarish threats challenge their unlikely relationship.

A historical fantasy that follows Eastern European teens Yehuda and Bluma on a journey through the Far Country, the Jewish land of the dead.

Soontornvat, Christina – All Thirteen: The Incredible Cave Rescue of the Thai Boys' Soccer Team

A unique account of the amazing Thai cave rescue told in a heart-racing, +796.52 Soo, Non-Fiction* you-are-there style that blends suspense, science, and cultural insight.

Stevenson, Noelle – The Fire Never Goes Out: A Memoir in Pictures

YA Biography Stevenson, Graphic Novels, Non-Fiction In a collection of personal comics, author-illustrator Stevenson tells of being a creative teen in the world.

Thomas, Aiden – Cemetery Boys

YA Thomas, Fiction; YA Thomas, Digital Audio Players*

Yadriel, a trans boy, summons the angry spirit of his high school's bad boy, and agrees to help him learn how he died, thereby proving himself a brujo, not a bruja, to his conservative family.

In this striking portrait of lives torn apart, the plight of migrants at the U.S. southern border is brought to light through poignant, vivid storytelling. An epic journey of danger, resilience, heartache, and hope.

Trung, Le Nguyen – The Magic Fish

It's hard enough trying to communicate with your parents as a kid, but for Tiâãen, he doesn't even have the right words because his Vietnamese parents are struggling with their English. Is there a way to tell them he's gay?

VanderMeer, Jeff – A Peculiar Peril YA VanderMeer, Fiction; YA VanderMeer, Digital Audio Books

A teenaged boy inherits his grandfather's mansion and discovers three strange doors, evidence his grandfather died of spectacularly unnatural causes, and family ties to an alternate Europe immersed in a magical war.

Vasquez Gilliland, Raquel – Sia Martinez and the Moonlit Beginning of Everything

YA Vasquez Gilliland, Fiction* Years after the ICE raid that takes her mother, Sia's mother emerges from a blue spacecraft that crashes in front of her.

Wolf, Allan – The Snow Fell Three Graves Deep: Voices from the Donner Party

A novel in verse that recounts the chilling survival tale of the Donner party during the 1846-1847 winter from the perspectives of its leaders, a scholarly wife, two Miwok guides, the Reed children, and other historical figures.

Yang, Gene Luen – Dragon Hoops

An introverted reader starts understanding local enthusiasm about sports in his school when he gets to know some of his talented athletic peers and discovers that their stories are just as thrilling as the comics he loves.

Yang, Gene Luen – Superman Smashes the Klan: The Graphic Novel **YA Superman, Graphic Novels** When her family is targeted by the KKK after moving from Chinatown to 1946 Downtown Metropolis, misfit Roberta Lee uses her keen skills of observation to help Superman thwart a string of terrorist attacks.

Zoboi, Ibi – Punching the Air

Award-winning author, Zoboi, and prison reform activist, Salaam, trace the story of an artist and poet whose prospects at a diverse art school are threatened by a racially biased system and a tragic altercation in a gentrifying neighborhood.

Zolidis, Don – War and Speech

Sydney is determined to sabotage the elitist speech team at her new school until she starts falling for the team's star member and sees she has a chance of shedding her "loser" status.
